## Independence

The children are becoming very independent and developing good self help skills as they get more practice at getting shoes and jackets on and off. We want them to share this success at home too, please encourage them to be independent with shoes

and jackets to continue to develop these skills and to show you how well they are doing. To help us with this, we ask for your support with a few things:

- Please ensure that children wear shoes that they can put on and take off by themselves. Shoes with laces, buckles and tight shoes that are tricky to get into prevent the children from being independent.
- Please ensure that your child's name/initials are on labels and inside shoes/wellies. We already have a growing collection of clothing that the children don't recognise. We know how expensive it is to replace clothing so names on labels would really help us to make sure all clothing is returned to you.
